

SUSTAINABILITY POLICY

Our sustainability policy has been in effect since July 2014. As a company, we joined the national olive oil initiative and, together with ChileOliva, we worked on improving the factors that contribute to the sustainability and competitiveness of our production processes.

To meet the specific goals established in the Clean Production Agreement, we continuously identify the most relevant environmental aspects, rank our management priorities, then take action on those items. Through these efforts, we aim to achieve higher levels of competitiveness and higher standards of sustainability.

Our commitment:

1. Work with sustainability indicators.
2. Strengthen the management of efficient water use.
3. Strengthen the energy management system in order to control and define our objectives and savings goals.
4. Improve the management and recovery of organic waste generated from the processing of our olives.
5. Establish hygiene and safety conditions to improve the work environment standards for our workers.
6. Strengthen workforce skills by training employees in clean production activity and matters related to sustainable development.

The indicators related to our policy are:

- Specific generation of industrial liquid waste (ILW).
- Water consumption per hectare.
- Specific consumption of field electrical energy.

- Percentage of renewable energy consumption.
- Specific generation of pomace.
- Specific generation of pulp.
- Percentage of hazardous waste generated.
- Percentage of solid waste recycled.
- Working days lost due to on-the-job accidents.
- Percentage of employees trained in environmental issues.
- Percentage of professional hours invested in social responsibility actions.

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
